Single Page: to be judged using the GTAPA standard evaluation.

Multi page: an entry of any shape and / or size (2 pages or more) in any format to be judged on popularity by balloting among members present.

How will you participate this year? What treasures do you have in your collections that can be assembled to tell a philatelic story that will captivate and enlighten your friends? If you have not previously done so, consider participating by building a Single Page, Multi-Page or One Frame Exhibit for this year's club exhibition. For those who have previously participated consider entering an exhibit in more than one class or add an additional exhibit for display only.

Building an exhibit in any of the above classes will provide you with significant personal satisfaction - a sense ofaccomplishment, completion and sharpening your philatelic skills.

To facilitate planning and organization, <u>please inform</u> Joseph and Don by email <u>as soon as possible this month</u> of your intent to exhibit and in what class; <u>Single Frame</u>- Everett <u>Drake Cup, Single Page</u> - Frank Alusio Award, or <u>Multi Page</u> - Ted Allen Cup

SINGLE FRAME COMPETITION

- As noted earlier the <u>16-page</u> single frame competition will be judged using relaxed National standards by a
 WTSC member and nationally accredited judge Robert Pinet. We are fortunate and privileged to benefit
 from Robert's expertise and to learn from the feedback that he will provide.
- See the additional document accompanying this month's Bulletin, "<u>Beginners Exhibiting a beginners</u>
 <u>overview of exhibiting"</u>; an excellent, most helpful document well worth a thorough read. It definitely "hits all the important stuff".
- Recognition: The Single Frame competition winner will have their name engraved on the **Everett Drake Cup** and receive a **free WTSC membership** for the 2023/24 club year.

MULTI-PAGE COMPETITION

- **Multi page:** an entry of any shape and/or size (<u>2 pages or more</u>) in any format to be judged on popularity by balloting among members present.
- In a sense this is an <u>anything goes category</u> with <u>no rules</u> other than an opportunity for you to share. It might be an exhibit consisting of a:
 - two or more-page philatelic story
 - few pages from your collection
 - brief research project
 - o philatelic exhibit that does not have enough content to fill one frame or one that exceeds one frame.
- This class is only limited by your imagination.
- Recognition: The Multi-Page competition winner will have their name engraved on the **Ted Allan Cup** and receive a **free WTSC membership** for the 2023/24 club year

SINGLE PAGE COMPETITION:

- Will be judged using the GTAPA standard evaluation. (Entries will tell a story using a minimum of three philatelic elements and have a title)
- Points to consider:
 - The Story told must be entirely contained on one page and should be one that cannot easily be expanded to a larger exhibit.
 - Should include three different elements i.e., stamps, covers and other recognized philatelic material with written text as needed to tell a "Philatelic Story."  - o Could include non-philatelic material, text or captions. (Must not overshadow philatelic items).
 - The story might relate to:
 - a particular Philatelic Item or Items
 - the issue or use of a particular stamp
 - Postal History or Postal Markings
 - Philatelic Research of some kind.
 - an unusual or specific event
 - a story which is Topical or Thematic.
- Recognition: The Single Page competition winner will have their name engraved on the **FRANK ALUSIO Award** and receive **a free WTSC membership** for the 2023/24 club year.

MAY LEARNING WORKSHOP

Starting at 7 p.m., Tuesday, May 2, 2023, via Zoom, our 8th virtual Learning Workshop topic of the 2022-2023 season is "Coronations and Celebrating Monarchy."

With the world preparing for King Charles III's May 6 coronation, let's give a royal wave to his and other philatelic crowning celebrations.

Many countries have issued stamps linked to the coronation of monarchs, regardless of their titles, which include: King, queen, caliph, czar, emperor, kaiser, khan, maharajah, mikado, mogul, pasha, potentate, rajah, shah, sheik and sultan. Many featured portraits, while others depicted special symbols including crowns, cyphers, jewels and maces.

On Feb. 8, the Royal Mail released its design for the first King Charles definitives. Released April 4, the five left-facing British self-adhesives were adapted from a portrait Martin Jennings prepared for Royal Mint coins.

The new monarch was named Canada's head of state on Sept. 10, 2022, after the death of his mother, Queen Elizabeth II. The first Canadian stamp to depict His Royal Highness is to be issued in May. The media published purported designs, but Canada Post maintained a regal silence.





His official investment comes 70 years after the Queen's coronation, which was commemorated with a widely-criticized Canadian stamp.

Based on a portrait by Ottawa photographer Yousuf Karsh (1908-2002), the "rushed" engraved purple four-cent designed by Emanuel Otto Hahn (1881-1957) and engraved by Silas Robert Allen (1888-1958), of the Canadian Bank Note Company, "is a disgrace to the country," with the Queen's features rendered "coarse and unbalanced," Toronto Telegram stamp columnist D.J. Knight told a Toronto club, the newspaper reported on May 26, 1953.

Reporter Peter Dempson later quoted an unnamed Post Office official being puzzled by complaints, saying "great pains were taken in the preparation. Numerous people were consulted — including the Queen — in the search for perfection."

Her Majesty was also commemorated on stamps Canada and other countries issued for anniversaries of her reign.





This country's earliest royal anniversary stamps were our first commemoratives — 16 double-portrait engraved 'Jubilees' issued in 1897 for the 60th anniversary of Queen Victoria's reign.

On a final note, May 6 has two significant dates for Britain's royals: King Edward VII died that day in 1910; Prince Archibald 'Archie" Harrison Mountbatten-Windsor, son of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle, the Duke and Duchess of Windsor, will turn four on the day his grandfather is crowned.

As with all Learning Workshops, participants are invited to share their treasured stamps and related covers. This topic should be a Crowning Touch!

WELCOME TO THE FIRST NATIONAL "UP TO 2 PAGES" EXHIBITION

At the Québec City Old Paper Show (28-29 October 2023)

After the great success of its 1st edition, which welcomed nearly 500 visitors over two days, the second edition of the **Québec City Old Paper Show**, which will take place next October 28-29 at the Patro Roc-Amadour in Québec City, has in store for us a great surprise! Indeed, the first national "Up to 2 Pages "exhibition will be organized there.


Collectors, if you hold an exceptional item, that is to say unique, rare or simply unusual, curious, funny or bizarre, in short an exceptional piece, which is commonly called a "talking piece", well this exhibition will be an opportunity for you to show it!

Hugo Deshaye and Grégoire Teyssier, the co-organizers of the Québec City Old Paper Show, explain the concept:

"Many collectors, whether they are philatelists, lovers of postal history, marcophily or historical documents, often hold real treasures, but rarely have the opportunity to share them. The exhibition we are organizing is an opportunity for these collectors to show their treasure to the general public. No need to embark on the long and tedious work of assembling a collection of several pages on several frames, since here, a single piece presented on a single page is enough! It's simple, fast, and effective! We hope that with this exhibition concept, many collectors will want to present, on a single page, their hidden treasure. At the same time, the public will be able to come and admire these exceptional pieces which will be brought together in one place".

At the choice of the exhibitors, the presentation may or may not be judged. If judged, it will be judged by a panel of recognized judges. The judging criteria will be roughly the same as for traditional exhibits: Importance, a good title - clear and precise, a nice presentation, appropriate research and one or more well-arranged piece(s) on one or two (8½ x 11) inch page(s). We have developed a new revolutionary scoring grid adapted to the judging of "Up to 2 Pages" exhibits.

The public will also be invited to choose the best presentations in each of the 3 main categories: Philately (which also



The 2nd **Québec City Old Paper Show** will therefore be an opportunity for collectors to share their treasures and for the general public to come and admire them. An awards ceremony and dinner will be held on Saturday evening at the Québec Yacht Club.
