President Sid's Message

Speaking of membership, a special welcome to three new members, Darin Cherniwchan, Charles Livermore and Ken Pugh, who all live far from Toronto but can participate via Zoom. Their expertise, knowledge and participation have been and continue to be valued. Having key philatelic leaders join is of benefit to all members and guests and will enable us to even more effectively share knowledge and grow the hobby.

As previously shared, the city-operated Fairfield Centre remains closed; therefore, we cannot yet meet face to face. Prior to that first meeting, a detailed COVID-19 safety plan will be communicated to all members.

Even though this may be still a few months away, <u>now</u> <u>is the time</u> to be sure that you will meet COVID safety requirements for entrance to city-operated recreation centres, which includes the Fairfield Centre.

As advised by the City of Toronto:

"Under the provincial requirements, in order to access certain indoor public settings and facilities, Ontarians aged 12 and older will need to provide proof that they are fully vaccinated, along with valid ID. Ontarians can print or download their vaccination receipt from the <u>provincial booking portal</u>. Ontario is developing an enhanced electronic vaccine certificate with a unique QR code and a verification app for businesses, which will be available by October 22."

Considering our club demographics and for the safety of all members, the WTSC COVID-19 safety plan will require proof of double vaccination with no exceptions allowed.

November Learning Workshop

Beginning at **7 PM**, **Tuesday**, **November 2**, **2021** via Zoom, our second virtual **Learning Workshop** of the 2021-2022 season is entitled **Original Research**. It's a short title, but carries a lot of weight.

Despite a plethora of articles, books and notes written for presentations and exhibits, new ground is still being broken on numerous topics.

Whether a collector has discovered varieties in modern or old issues, the thrill of the chase — especially if something previously unreported is discovered — can be exhilarating.

The same is true for postal history, including about people whose names are on envelopes they sent or received.

A Philatelic Specialists Society of Canada member recently related how he garnered the life story of a southern Ontario lawyer. Based simply on a cover addressed to him, details about his life, family and careers emerged from myriad sources, including his diary in the Ontario archives.


Sources include previously-published information, but original research requires going further. Some sites that can provide information include: Postmaster-General's annual reports; biographies and encyclopedias; Library & Archives Canada files; city archives, directories and maps; plus old newspapers.

For this Learning Workshop, we will have the pleasure of hearing about several successful research adventures.

Garfield Portch will describe learning about the littleknown postal activities at Union Station, before a post office was opened there in 1927.



Old Union Station, Station and Simcoe Streets, Toronto, on colorized postcard mailed in 1914 from city's main post office.




1884 Ward 3 map of Toronto shows former Union Station beside railway tracks (centre left).

Our president, Sid Mensinga, assembled quite a postal history collection related to Gravenhurst, Ontario, one of his favorite communities. In addition to information about the town's post office, postmasters and postmarks, he garnered details about Camp Calydor. Known as Camp 20, it was a federal government-operated prisoner-of-war facility between 1940 and 1946, where German officers wrote and received mail from home.
