Saving Toronto's Postal Station "K"

Postal Station "K" is historic. Constructed in 1936 and located on the site of Montgomery's Tavern where William Lyon McKenzie and his rebels gathered in the 1837 rebellion, it is one of the few buildings in the world (the only one in Canada) to bear the insignia (lion and unicorn) of Edward VIII. Canada Post wishes to sell the site. According to the press, over 7,000 people have signed a petition asking that Station "K" be saved. If you wish to sign on, please see Frank Alusio.



Machin Study Group: A Perspective

The Machin Study Group was formed in early 2011 after discovery in late 2010 that 7 Club members were interested in the Machin Head definitive issues of Great Britain. Our first meeting was arranged for that February. E-mails were sent to other GTAPA clubs inviting them to attend.

About 20 members and guests attended the first meeting, which seemed to be a pretty good start. The evening was spent meeting each other and discovering that none of us was an expert and we were all somewhat overwhelmed by the potential complexity of the topic.

A year and a half later, our membership includes not only members of our Club but members of North Toronto, Scarborough, Bramalea, and Ajax/Whitby. Our web presence has attracted a new member from Oakville, and Internet followers in Ottawa, Winnipeg, Chicago and Britain!

In order to have some level of consistency, we agreed early on (more or less) to use the DEEGAM catalogue and numbering system while also following the Machin outline offered by Robin Harris on his adminware.ca website.

Over the next 18 months we continued to meet monthly with all members participating in an education programme. Through individual study we all discovered some aspect of the Machin issue that became worthy of either a show-and-tell or a full PowerPoint presentation. The key to success was that everyone made a valuable contribution and all learned something from every presentation.

For the 2012-13 collecting season, the Group has agreed to participate in the WTSC annual competition in May 2013. To that end, each member has been assigned a specific topic and will prepare a one-page entry on that topic. We expect to present a single-frame entry and a number of single pagers in competition for the Alusio Award.

What have we learned that might attract others to join us? In my view, we learned that: (1) a large and complex issue can be tackled by reducing it to smaller, more manageable components; (2) we can learn from each other; (3) personal discipline is involved in studying a complex issue that can be transferred to other aspects of the hobby; (4) our fellow philatelists are exceedingly generous with their time, knowledge and information, and care about and are interested in the collections of others; (5) philately in a group setting is more fun than working in private frustration at home.

The Machin Group has, in my opinion, been extremely successful. As well as learning about Machins, all of us have enjoyed the camaraderie a small group offers. I invite and encourage you to visit. Who knows, you might be the next person to take up the study of Machins. (Garfield)

UKRAINPEX-2012

At UKRAINPEX-2012 (Toronto, September 28-30), Club member Mark Stelmachovich garnered 4 awards: bronze for "A Sampling of Ukraine's Bogus Provisional Stamps"; vermeil for "Ukrainian Stamps Missing in Action"; and 2 gold for "Ukraine's Contemporary Provisional Stamps, and a Wrapper, 1992-1995", and "Ukraine's Trident-Overprinted Russian Revenue Stamps of Podila 1918-1919".
