Each Christmas Day I have a tradition of listening to the Royal Christmas Message. This year as I listened to Her Majesty, I thought of George V, her stamp-collecting grandfather, who delivered the first Royal Message during Christmas 1932. I resolved to learn more about the famous philatelic collection of the Royal Family.

I was astounded to discover that the collection of just George V alone is housed in 328 red albums of about 60 pages each, and that altogether there is

enough unmounted material to fill about 2,000 albums.

George V was such a passionate collector that when in London he tried to spend 3 afternoons a week uninterrupted working on his collection.

It was quite easy for me to find information on the Royal stamp collection, and it could be just as easy for you to learn something about an interesting philatelic matter too.

This year, pick a topic you've always wanted to learn more about. Research it, tell me what you discovered, and I'll put it in an issue of the Bulletin for all Club members to share in your discovery.

Saving Toronto's Postal Station "K"

Update: Historic Postal Station "K", located on the site of Montgomery's Tavern where William Lyon McKenzie and his rebels gathered in the 1837 rebellion and the only building in Canada to bear the insignia (lion and unicorn) of Edward VIII, has been sold to a private developer, the Rockport Group, with no requirement that the historic integrity of the building be preserved. Press reports however indicate the developer may be prepared to preserve the front of the building by incorporating it into the development. Stay tuned.

Fall Invitational Auction

The Fall Invitational Auction on December 11 was a great success. Thirty-nine members attended, 26% more than in 2011. The catalogue value of lots, \$5,380, was up 139% over 2011.

The auction, conducted by our own Reay Cairns, attracted 19 buyers who spent on average \$35 each. The net realization was \$664 or 12% of the catalogue value.
