## From the Editor

This April will mark the 101<sup>st</sup> anniversary of the sinking of the Titanic.

All of us know the story about the seemingly unsinkable liner striking an iceberg in the North Atlantic and going down with enormous loss of life.

But how many know that the Titanic was not only a passenger ship but also a mail ship, and that its name included R.M.S. (for Royal Mail Ship)?

R.M.S. Titanic carried 5 postal workers, 2 from Britain and 3 from the USA. All fought to the end to protect the mail. None survived. Their courage, devotion to duty and sacrifice is legendary.

The Postal Museum at the Smithsonian has an on-line exhibit devoted to the 5 postal workers. It is well worth viewing at any time and especially as the anniversary of the sinking approaches. Go to <http://www.postalmuseum.si.edu/titanic/>

## Saving Toronto's Postal Station "K"

Update: According to a report on January 28, 2013 in [urbantoronto.ca](http://urbantoronto.ca), Rockport Group, the purchaser of Postal Station "K", "have indicated their intention to work with City [of Toronto] heritage staff and the community to retain the front of the building, while demolishing the rear portion of the structure to construct a residential tower on the property. The plan would also include an enhancement of the public area in front of the building." If this were to occur, the historic front of the postal station would be preserved. Stay tuned.

## February Discussion Group Session

On February 19 well-known philatelist and author Charles J.G. Verge spoke on the 1959 St. Lawrence Seaway stamp, jointly issued by Canada and the USA, and the Canadian invert. He provided an insight into the stamp's development, how the invert came to be and the number in existence.
