"ARTICLE VI – ELECTIONS"

<u>Section 1 – Term</u>

The Officers and Directors of the CLUB shall be elected by ballot for a two-year term with the election held bi-annually at the second regular meeting of May of even-numbered year. The term of office shall commence on 1 September and shall conclude on 31 August.

Section 2 - Voting

All active members in good standing, and in attendance at the election meeting, shall be qualified to vote. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall be elected.

Section 3 - Nominees

Any member in good standing may nominate a candidate for the Election. Nominations from the floor may also be accepted provided the candidate has given his/her consent.

Section 4 - Conduct

JUNE LEARNING WORKSHOP

Starting at 7 p.m., Tuesday, June 4, 2024 via Zoom, the topic for our 9th virtual Learning Workshop of the 2023-2024 season is: **'Modern philately — a collecting opportunity you don't want to miss'.**

Club members often enjoy classic-era collectibles, for the beauty of the stamp engravings, myriad varieties, postal history and the challenge of acquiring decent examples. Exhibits the world over have included treasures from various countries, and a plethora of articles plus books have provided even more details.

Moving on, a whole wide world worthy of consideration and appreciation awaits with issues produced over the past halfcentury. Some hobbyists are keen, others not so much. To spur your interest, I have cited a few examples from a broad range of subjects, most available without overly-lightening your pockets.




Stamps are now often produced with numerous colours, images and special features that surpass old-style stamp-printing. Instead of seeking one of each, some collectors prefer favourite designs and, of course, despite precautionary measures at the security printing plants, there are examples with tagging, perforation and printing errors.





In addition to regular definitives and commemoratives, related miniature sheets provide additional artwork and – in Canada — are prepared with different perforations and gum.

Here are three excellent contemporary mini-sheets: Canada, Norway and Greenland released joint issues 20 years ago depicting famous Norwegian explorer Otto Sverdrup (1854-1930) and crewmen, with images of his ice-trapped Arctic exploration ship; two stamps plus outer artwork on another 2004 souvenir sheet feature several motorcycles; particularly attractive and multi-faceted, dogs, cats and a parrot are in cages on the 2013 'Choose Adoption' mini-sheet, with drawings showing other critters in more pleasant, less-restrictive venues.





Some registered covers come with large stamps, including \$1, \$1.50, \$2 and \$5 outdoor scene definitives issued between 1972 and 1986. Even more challenging to acquire are ones franked with \$1, \$2, \$4, \$5, \$8 and \$10 Domestic Wildlife definitives issued from 1998 to 2018, often with added postage to complete a rate. If such covers are too elusive, especially posted inperiod, all of those wildlife images were printed as singles on first-class rate postal stationery envelopes – yet another collectible topic.

There are also many modern covers with special designs, some produced by stamp clubs for exhibitions, fairs and anniversaries, others with

Picture Postage stamps produced by Canada Post until that program was cancelled in September 2022. Some businesses use covers with special cachets, and the Vincent Graves Greene Philatelic Foundation in Toronto has produced ones commemorating special speakers.



Stay tuned for an evening with these — and, hopefully, more — interesting talking points.

Lastly, consider this: If you only focus on past philatelic subjects, you could be closing the door on a worthwhile new collecting adventure.
