

GOOGLE IMAGE VS STAMP IDENTIFIERstamp identification a report by WTSC

member Douglas Hill

This past year I compared the performance of Stamp Identifier with Google Images.

My findings are attached. Despite what someone might say, Stamp Identifier is still free. On the opening screen, the trick is to scroll down past the two paid options and select "continue with ads."

Conclusion: Since both programs are free, Google



DECEMBER LEARNING WORKSHOP

Starting at 7 p.m., Tuesday, Dec. 2, 2025 via Zoom, the topic for our third virtual Learning Workshop of the 2025-2026 season is: **"What do you value in your collection-collections, and why?"**

Regardless of whether you have a thorough collection of a country's definitives and commemoratives including varieties, revenues, Special Delivery, Registered, postage dues, airmails, war tax, and, possibly, fakes, forgeries and counterfeits, scores of attractive covers and postcards, or albums filled with stamps featuring colourful themes, a particular gem or two often stands out.

Whether inherited, received as a gift or via a trade, found in a dealer's bargain box, bought at an in-person or online auction for a reasonable price or at a cost worth the investment due to rarity or attractiveness, once belonging to a prominent collector, or acquired via unusual circumstances, it may generate a fun tale to tell.

Regardless, there are bound to be stories worth sharing. On the flip side, having been unable to acquire a special item may provide an interesting, ironic subject.

Such memories may also serve as a worthwhile lesson for others seeking treasures.


On a final note, there comes a time when you will decide to dispose of a collection, having completed it as much as possible, in order to pursue other topics, or to provide space on a bulging bookcase.
